School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Fairmount Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Fairmount Elementary values the contributions and involvement of families to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Fairmount Elementary will support family engagement and how families can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Fairmount Elementary School invited all families to attend orientation this fall to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the school improvement plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, family input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year by contacting the front office. The plan is posted on our school website for families to view. All feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online to ask parents for their suggestions. Families can also give feedback during several meetings and activities during the school year. In addition, we encourage anyone who would like to support this process to apply to be on our Parent Advisory Council that meets through the year to provide feedback and adjust plans for all school operations.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Fairmount Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

The plan will be posted on the school website and social media. Families can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the front office of the school.

What is Title I?

Fairmount Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

Parent and Family Engagement

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Community Outreach
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Fairmount Elementary will take the following measures to empower and support parents and family members as an important foundation of our school in order to strengthen the school and reach our goals.

We will:

- ❖ Ensure that all information related to school and family programs, meetings, and other activities is published in English and Spanish; posted on the school website; and included in the monthly school newsletter for all families.
- ❖ Provide monthly trainings for staff during their planning periods on strategies to improve communication with families and ideas to increase family engagement in reading and math for our students outside of the classroom. - ❖ Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding school-wide events and activities, through phone messages, our website, social media, and flyers.
- ❖ Work with our families to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of parent and family engagement and how to support student learning.
- ❖ Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.
- ❖ Use our Partners in Education and School-Community Team to improve awareness of the activities and events listed in the school parent and family engagement policy.
- ❖ Collect feedback from parents and family members at all events in order to respond to parents' requests for additional support for parent and family engagement activities.
